
# Process for Requesting CCTV Footage in Howick Village


There have been some incidents in the Village recently and we have received requests for CCTV footage.




# Would you like to play a part in our community, have fun and build new friendships?




# Waste Management Results from HOP 2023

## A piece of Howick history

Shamrock Cottage - Shamrock Cottage in Selwyn Road is one of Auckland's oldest and most important buildings as it was built as a wet canteen for thirsty soldier-settlers in November 1847. After minor alterations in 1848 it reopened as the "Royal Hotel" with former Fencible Benjamin Lewis as publican, supplying "the choicest wines and spirits with stabling for horses" and accommodation for 11 guests. Famous suffragette Amey Daldy wife of Captain W. C. Daldy, lived here from 1894 as a holiday

home. They called it "Shamrock Cottage" after the 85 ton schooner that the Captain sailed from Liverpool to Auckland in 1841. Amey Daldy founded the Women's Franchise League and campaigned for women's right to vote, equal pay for men and women and equal share of assets in divorce.

The cottage was saved from demolition in 1968 and with donations it was restored by the Howick Historical Society members and Howick RSA volunteers.
